

Update - Beechmont Road landslip repairs

July 2018

Transport and Main Roads' (TMR) work to repair 23 landslips (10 major and 13 minor) along Beechmont Road, Lower Beechmont are progressing well with around half the sites now complete or in the final stages.

The 23 landslips are located in the 16-kilometre stretch of road from the Nerang-Murwillumbah Road intersection. Mobile traffic signals are in use at various sites (including the sites pictured below and right) with traffic being directed one-way at a time around the works.

Two other major landslip sites are also under repair near Mirani Street with a large piling rig in place at one of the sites. This site is the project's largest landslip with 22 piles (concrete columns) being installed more than 20 metres into the ground.

The project thanks motorists and local residents for their patience and understanding during these works.
